

MILLCREEK CANYON LEASH LAW

- On May 29, 2001, the Salt Lake County Council passed an ordinance changing the requirement for leashing dogs in Millcreek Canyon
- Salt Lake County Ordinance #1480, Section V Chapter 8.04.170: requires that dogs <u>MUST</u> <u>BE LEASHED IN THE ENTIRE CANYON</u> on <u>EVEN-NUMBERED DAYS</u> and are allowed to be unleashed on odd-numbered days except in developed areas.
- RULES/GUIDELINES TO ENSURE THE CONTINUED PRIVILEGE OF DOG RECREATION IN THE CANYON.
 - ❖ Dogs <u>MUST BE LEASHED ON ALL DAYS</u> in <u>DEVELOPED AREAS</u>: picnic grounds, parking lots, roads and housing developments. (36 CFR 261.14(j)). Unleashed dogs are **PROHIBITED** in these areas.
 - ❖ Dogs may be **OFF-LEASH** on **ODD DAYS ONLY.**
 - ❖ Dog handlers <u>MUST CLEAN-UP</u> after their dog and dispose of waste in proper receptacles provided at trailheads, in parking lots, and near restrooms. (36 CFR 261.11(b)).
 - ❖ Hostile and Aggressive dogs **MUST BE REMOVED** from the Canyon. Dogs and owners creating problems must leave.
 - ❖ Dogs may not chase wildlife or disturb their habitat such as streams, ponds or other natural areas.
 - ❖ Dog handlers MUST CARRY A LEASH not to exceed six (6) feet in length at all times.
 - ❖ Dog handlers are under **STRICT LIABILITY** for any incident or injury caused by their dog(s).
 - ❖ All dogs must be <u>VISIBLE</u> and under <u>VOICE CONTROL</u> of the handler at all times in all areas of the Canyon on <u>OFF-LEASH DAYS</u>.
 - ❖ Dogs in heat or with communicable diseases are not allowed in the Canyon at any time. Be sure your dog has up-to-date vaccinations.
 - * Respect the right of other Canyon users and do not allow your dog to bark at, rush towards, or jump on other people. Even a friendly dog can frighten visitors through these behaviors.
